Red Shed Report

From Steve Marden: Your **campground fees** of \$120 for 2012 are due by December 31, 2012. Mail your check payable to GRRC, with a vehicle license number OR a short description of your camper/trailer/RV in the memo section of the check, to Steve Marden, 2136 Ford Pkwy, PMB359, St. Paul, MN 55116. Any questions, call me at 612-332-8828.

From Dave Anderson: I was checked out on the new tractor by Dave Newell. I put the brush-hog on and cut the field between 4 Corner and the MP range. It worked well. I also cut one-inch trees with no problem. Using the bucket, I moved about a third of the sawdust pile. Everything worked really well.

Blaze Orange required: You may not hunt or trap during any open season where deer may be taken by firearms (including special hunts, early antlerless, youth seasons, and muzzleloader) under applicable laws and ordinances unless the visible portion of your cap and outer clothing above the waist, excluding sleeves and gloves, is blaze orange. **Red is not a legal color**, except for those who qualify under the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993. Blaze orange includes a camouflage pattern of at least 50 percent blaze orange within each square foot. This restriction does not apply to migratory waterfowl hunters on waters or in a stationary shooting location or to trappers on waters. Muzzleloader season is open until 12-9-2012. **Blaze orange must be worn at the GRRC range until 12-9-2012!**

From the XO: We may have issues with **range safety and security**. I've been told that at least couple members have driven past the range when no matches have been held and late at night only

to have seen the gate open. The gate may be left open during daylight hours for matches, work days, and meetings when the gate will be closed by the last member out after adjournment; otherwise it needs to be closed and locked so that non-members may not use the ranges and the curious public can't wander about the property. While GRRC is a private club and only members, their guests, and match participants may use the range, I'm most concerned with the curious public wandering around the property when they have no good knowledge about the range and who may be shooting where.

So if you know that there are no events occurring or you drive past the gate after dark and see the gate open, please close it. Everyone who is on the property is either a guest or a match participant camping with member(s) present, thus all can get out if needed. - **Bruce Aune**

GRRC BOD Meeting 8/21/12

The Board of Directors Meeting was held August 21, 2012 at the Red Shed, Harris, MN.

Those attending were: Morgan Prock, Dave Newell, Kim Frick, Laurie Pekarik, Steve Marden, Rik Rarrick, Steve Shimek, Bruce Aune and Rick Loye. Those excused: Rich Williams, Andy Mager, Tom Torborg, Mike Gjersvig, Rut McGhee and Bruce Peglow. There was a quorum present.

President, David Newell called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m. for the purpose of listening to a demonstration by Larry Sparks on how the existing shotgun range could be turned into a dual purpose range to include a skeet range.

Larry showed the layout of how the existing shotgun range could be used for skeet shooting as well as trap. Dirt work would have to be done to level out and fill in areas to be able to build a skeet range that met specifications and also to fill in a low area on the pistol range. Motion was made by Steve Marden to allow an additional \$2,500 above the 2012 budget for a feasibility study of \$500 for a skeet range or a total of \$3,000. The motion was seconded by Bruce Aune. Steve Shimek amended the motion to take that amount to do the dirt work out of the existing \$10,000 budget for the target shed on the MP range. Second by Rick Rarrick. There was no further discussion. Carried.

There was some discussion about GRRC is long overdue in applying for **NRA Gold Club** status. This designation would enable GRRC to apply for a range improvement grant. The task is to find out what obligation(s) GRRC would have to the NRA if such a grant was received.

GRRC BOD Meeting 10/8/12

A quorum was present at Kraus-Hartig with all board members present, including Larry Sparks, Lee Larson, Wade Brown and Dave Secord as guests. The meeting was called to order by the President, David Newell at 7:03 p.m.

Vice President Kim Frick, led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence to observe departed members and those serving in the military,

Secretary's Report: Mike Gjersvig made a motion, with second by Tom Torborg, to accept the minutes from the March 12, 2012 BOD meeting. Carried. Steve Shimek made a motion, with second by Rut McGhee to accept the minutes from the August 2012 BOD meeting. Carried

Executive Officer's Report: Bruce Aune made a proposal for signage on the GRRC acreage so all members know when the range(s) are closed. Red signs are now in place on the Pistol Range explaining the **only allowed ammunition 22 rf and center-fire pistol ammo**. Discussion continued on how to arrive at a way to communicate to the membership about range closures.

Bruce expressed the frustration of GRRC members who come to the range and expect to shoot when some or all of the ranges are closed due to scheduled events. Discussion focused on several solutions. A committee of Bruce Aune, Chair, Kim Frick, Steve Marden, Rut McGhee, Bruce Peglow, Laurie Pekarik, and Morgan Prock will meet and offer recommendations back to the BOD.

Bruce also said that the Range Rules will be printed and posted on all the ranges. Different printing materials and posting methods are being developed.

Treasurer's Report: Motion, with second, to accept as given respectively by Bruce Peglow and Bruce Aune. Carried.

Correspondence: Receipt of a letter from the MN Dept. of Taxation regarding a check issued in 2009 for return of an overpayment on Sales Tax has not been deposited. Arrangements are in place to issue a replacement.

Letter received from the East Central Energy power company indicating that tree and brush-growth interfering with the power lines/conductors will be trimmed back 20' either side of the power lines along the roadway in the near future. The trimming occurs every 4-5 years. NAT as the trimming is ongoing.

OLD BUSINESS

Tractor: A Kabota tractor has been located at Lano Implement, Anoka, MN; it is priced at the top of our budgeted amount of \$18,000. Tractor to be delivered to the range at no charge by Lano, with purchase conditional on this unit meeting GRRC expectations.

M-1 for Vets: July 14 event was an overwhelming success. There were more helpers than shooters. Planning the 2013 event will have an improved schedule.

K-D pits retaining wall: There is concern that the ends of the concrete walls are dirt and they need to be made more secure to control erosion. Gordy Mitchell is checking on year-end block prices; he should have cost estimates soon to finish the pit wall.

Skeet Range development: Larry Sparks said the Skeet Range dirt work has been completed. It was agreed that the Shotgun Range is a wetland and, as such, its habitat will not be disturbed. He then presented an additional verbal budget for construction of physical features on a Skeet Range that would co-exist with the established Shotgun Range. He estimated this cost at \$10,000, which would include two houses, concrete station pads, concrete pads under both houses, electrical, and two throwers. BOD referred this proposal back to Larry

to have him submit the above items in a written itemized request for the 2013 budget.

Long-range planning for a token box or debit card system [to cover the cost of the skeet range whenever shooters want to use the skeet range on an individual basis] is not included in this budget estimate.

FFL: Steve Shimek made a motion, with Tom Torborg giving the second, that it is **not in the best interest of GRRC** to be a purchasing agent for the general membership. Discussion. Carried.

Finishing Mower: Steve Marden made a motion, with second from Steve Shimek, to approve the acquisition of a finishing mower if it is part of the purchase agreement of the tractor. It was agreed that the BOD wants to have a finishing mower included as part of the purchase on the tractor. Carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Bullseye CMP Pistol Discipline: Kurt Borlaug and Tom Torborg will be interim discipline chairs. Approval of this new discipline is requested based on the need for GRRC to have an outdoor bullseye range. There is a significant number of bullseye shooters that pass through Minnesota on their way to the Nationals. Estimated budget for 2013 is \$1,500. There will be CMP National representatives touring the range on November [14] to view the facilities. Following this tour, Kurt and Tom will have a better idea if a bid from GRRC may be considered as a hosting-range for the 2014 nationals.

F-Class discipline: Wade Brown presented information about the events for this discipline. BOD approved adding F-Class on the 2013 Range Schedule of events on the K-D range.

Annual Banquet: Kim Frick has scheduled the banquet for **Friday February 22, 2013**, at Kraus-Hartig. The menu will feature the Rib dinner with all the trimmings. Ticket price will be announced. Kim needs donations for door prizes.

2014 Goose Creek Rendezvous: 2014 will be the 25th Anniversary of the Rendezvous. Morgan Prock, chair of this event, requested an extended schedule to 11 days. BOD referred this proposal back to the Rendezvous Committee as this schedule [Sept 11-21] conflicts with too many scheduled events at the range. NAT. Review at Nov. 12 BOD meeting.

Fall Workday Weekend: October 27 and 28 are the dates. Discipline Chairs, get your requests into Kim as soon as possible. Workers, bring your hand-tools and power equipment to help spruce up the range; collect a workday credit for each full day worked.

The President entertained a motion to adjourn, which was made by Bruce Peglow; second by Kim Frick to adjourn at 9:50pm. Motion carried.

GRRC GMM Meeting 10/16/12

President David Newell called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. at the Kraus-Hartig VFW. A quorum of 55 members and 3 guests was present.

Vice-President Kim Frick led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed to honor those serving in the military and departed members.

Secretary's Report: The GMM minutes from September 2012 were published in the Gazette. Motion made by Jerry Sadowski with second by Mike Gjersvig to accept the minutes as published. Motion carried.

Executive Officer's Report: Bruce was at the range for BPCR and said that a fair amount of dirt work has been well done on the Skeet and K-D ranges. He observed that LR shooters and others are using clays on the K-D range. Please clean up your debris. Comment received that there is no reason for clays as orange paint has been substituted.

Chief Instructor's Report: No report.

First Readings: Alan Laquasto, Everett Madsen and Thomas J. Erickson. **Second Readings:** from August – Mark Krueger (absent), Derrek Green (present), Marc Hildebrandt (absent), Steve Walsh (present) and Michael Haase (absent). The Sergeant at Arms led the applicants, guests and non-members from the room.

Treasurer's Report: Ditto said that all match directors have done a good job with providing their shooters lists and turning in their match fees. GRRC continues to be in the black. He asked for 2013 budget requests, which are due by the November 2012 GMM. Motion was made by Rick Loye, with second by Ron Schwatctgen. Motion carried.

Archery: Dave asked for anyone interested in chairing this discipline to see him after the meeting.

Black Powder: There will be a meeting at North Branch Bullseye on 10-17 at 6 p.m.

BP Cartridge: The last match was last weekend. Other than being cold, wet, and windy, everyone had a good time. January 4, 2013 is "Freeze Your Parts Off". See range schedule for the time.

Finance: Ron said that 2013 budget requests are due at the November 2012 GMM.

Juniors: The Juniors will resume their indoor shooting at the Forest Lake American Legion on November 29, 2012. Come out to help score their targets. Your help is always needed.

Legislative Committee: Vote on November 6 for the "right" people.

Membership: About 20% of the membership have sent in their 2013 membership renewals.

Newsletter: October's issue of the Gazette was sent hardcopy to the membership, which includes the 2013 Membership Renewal form.

Pistol: Steve Shimek said that help is needed on the Fall Workday, 10/27 to complete the outdoor storage area.

Schutzen: The last two matches were a success and plans are underway to add two more matches for 2013. Look for details in the future.

Shotgun: Work is still in progress on the development of the Skeet Range. The thrower will be in operation through the winter.

Website: The Gazette is on the GRRRC website. More hits are coming to the website all the time.

Good and Welfare/Correspondence: A thank you was received from Bill Prock for the flowers delivered following his recent surgery. A memorial and card will be mailed to the family of member Terry Ruffi to mark his recent passing. [See obit.]

OLD BUSINESS

Tractor update: Dave said this has been a four-year ongoing issue, and said that a possible unit has located. The tractor should be at the range on the Fall Work Day. Lee Larson, Rik Rarick and Gary Vandekamp, for now, are the authorized users due to their experience with a unit like this. If others are interested in becoming an authorized user, come to the Fall Work Day to ask about being certified. The key is to be put away securely. Insurance will be secured.

Annual Banquet: Reserve **Friday, February 22, 2013** for the banquet at Kraus-Hartig, with social from 6-7 p.m., dinner at 7 p.m. Tickets estimated at \$23.00 each. Contact Kim Frick for donations for door prizes.

Fall Workday: Kim Frick needs your work requests in time to schedule for the 10/27 work day at the range. Workday credit is available to members and those on the Waiting List. NEW BUSINESS

Member usage of county roads to range: Dave Anderson said that two neighbors want something done about dust control on the roads to the range. Estimated number of member and participant vehicles using the roads is easily 600+/- per month due to the number of events scheduled at the range and the number of registrants at each event. This number does not include the number of individuals shooting at the range on any given month.

For informational purposes, the cost of blacktopping the gravel road from the paved county road to the gate at the range would cost about \$200,000. Chisago County would pay for half. If this plan gets in the works for approval, the cost would be spread out over 5 years at a cost of \$20,000 per year, or an annual assessment to the members at \$40/year for 5 years. For some reason, Chisago County cannot assess each property owner for this improvement. Questions arose about asking if the Chisago County Board would be open to negotiation on the cost and participation on this project. In addition, a suggestion, offered from the floor, that GRRRC wait until an official letter is received from Chisago County. NAT. Matter referred to the BOD.

VP Report on Fall WorkDay: Kim Frick

The fall work day on Saturday the 27th turned out to be a nice dry day, after a week of on and off rain. There were about 25 people that turned out to get some final projects done before the weather turns against us for another year.

The new tractor had arrived, and it was immediately tasked with moving the earth around the end of the pit wall. About a dozen men worked from early morning till dark building the retaining wall from 80 pound landscape blocks around the ends of the wall. This addition to the already completed grading and culvert installation should resolve the standing water problem on the pit walkway. There remained the job of removing the vegetation from beneath the target frames which was keeping the water from draining down, and several got done, but several target points remain to be done. Thanks to everyone who spent the day doing this back-breaking work, and thanks for bringing in the skid loader to help in the project.

On the shotgun range Larry Sparks and his crew were digging the trenches for the wiring for the trap house and skeet throwers. The ground there was pretty soft from the fill that had just been delivered and spread around to level the shooting points. There was also some brush and limb cleanup done on the range to keep back the overgrowth.

Other projects accomplished were a general cleanup of the property, including old targets and cardboard and even removal of an old microwave oven. The dumpster was full to the top by the end of the day. The circus wagon was restocked with firewood and kindling on the black powder range, as was the shed on the pistol range, the trailer on the MP range and the wood box at the red shed. Also the outside wood rack at the red shed received a metal roof and a full load of wood in preparation of the deer hunters staying there during season. The north property line was reposted with no trespassing signs and the northwestern border was noted to no longer have any fence on the property line. (Next time)

Legislative Report: Steve Marden



An excerpt from the NRA/ILA page on the United Nations Treaty issues: "The latest rumor making its way through the darker corners of the internet is an inaccurate spin on the U.N.'s never-ending mission to disarm the American people. The rumors vary, but some have wrongly claimed that the U.S. has secretly adopted a U.N. Arms Trade Treaty, subjecting Americans to the schemes of U.N. gun controllers.

The confusion stems from a misunderstanding of the differences between July's month-long **U.N. Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT)** and the **Second Review Conference for the U.N. Programme of Action on Small Arms and Light Weapons (POA)** that took place August 27 through September 7. The ATT and POA, while having many of the same anti-gun supporters and objectives, are two distinct U.N. initiatives.

The ATT would be a **legally binding treaty** that would require parties to the treaty to adhere to the treaty's provisions, many of which (as proposed in July) are incompatible with our Second Amendment rights. For the treaty to be ratified it would have to be approved by a two-thirds vote in the U.S. Senate. During the July ATT conference, NRA conducted a successful campaign to stop the treaty. The treaty has been shelved for the moment, but there have been attempts to revive it.

The POA, on the other hand, is an **attempt to create a voluntary international set of standards for the control of small arms**. Under the program, states are encouraged to adopt these controls domestically and to report on their progress. Although many of the standards proposed in the POA process conflict with the rights of gun owners, the U.S. has participated in the discussions. However, no domestic legislation has been passed as a result. The POA is not an extension or alternative to the ATT."

The POA, on the other hand, is an **attempt to create a voluntary international set of standards for the control of small arms**. Under the program, states are encouraged to adopt these controls domestically and to report on their progress. Although many of the standards proposed in the POA process conflict with the rights of gun owners, the U.S. has participated in the discussions. However, no domestic legislation has been passed as a result. The POA is not an extension or alternative to the ATT."

President's Notes: Dave Newell

With the November General Membership meeting almost upon us, it's time not just to think about what went on this summer at the range, but where we are going next year.

The discipline chairs have been working on, and should be completing, their budgets for 2013. One of the requirements this year is to look forward and think about where we want to be 2-5 years from now. Five years ago we talked about, planned, and budgeted for a new building to replace the Red Shed.

A new target shed in the pits is something that needs to be completed. Extending the concrete deck between the shooting covers on the MP range and covering all of the shooting firing points would be a great improvement. The cover over the BP range has been a wonderful addition and makes one think we should cover the pistol range as well. Adding skeet to the trap range might happen as soon as next year. How about electricity to all ranges?

GRRC has completed some incredible tasks; by planning ahead, many of these projects are very possible. **GRRC needs information from the members and discipline chairs regarding their vision for the range.**

If you have been to the range in the last two weeks, you might have seen the newest addition to our range. The week before the fall work day, the Lano equipment company from Anoka delivered a Kubota L3940 tractor for GRRC to evaluate and determine if it would meet our needs. The tractor is a 2007 model that is still being sold.

We have used it extensively while doing a wide range of work projects. Knocking down brush, moving soil, and back blade work were all easily accomplished. Mowing grass was the only task not tried, but being the least difficult task, we don't anticipate any issues. Finding a tractor that would fit into our requirements wasn't easy.

The L3940 has 40 hp with 33 hp at the PTO; this provides enough power to do the work around the range without being too expensive to run. Running the tractor with the brush-hog and doing some loader work for 6 hours of run-time consumed about 2 gallons of diesel fuel. Our tractor came with an upgraded loader and a "HST Plus" (hydrostatic) transmission.
